MEETING HELD VIA ZOOM

1           MAYOR KELLY: Good morning. Welcome  
2 to pre agenda. Today is Monday, May 3rd.  
3 It's 10 a.m.

4           We have one public hearing on the  
5 schedule for tomorrow evening to amend  
6 Chapter 225 Section 225-81 Parking  
7 Prohibited on Crescent Street. And this  
8 is Commissioner Dalton's.

9           Do you have anything to add there,  
10 Commissioner?

11          Okay.

12          COMMISSIONER DALTON: Can you hear  
13 me? Sorry, can you hear me?

14          MAYOR KELLY: I can now, yeah.

15          COMMISSIONER DALTON: No, I do not  
16 at this time.

17          MAYOR KELLY: Okay. Thank you.

18          We have one presentation tomorrow  
19 and that's on this Fire EMS Station 3.

20          Then we're moving on to the consent  
21 agenda. Are there any edits or changes?

22          COMMISSIONER DALTON: Nope.

23          MAYOR KELLY: Okay.

24          So on to the Mayor's Department. My  
25 first item is a Discussion: Cannabis

1           Legislation.

2           My second item is approval for the  
3           Mayor to sign an Occupational Medicine  
4           Services Agreement with Saratoga  
5           Hospital. And this is a -- Saratoga  
6           Hospital will provide to the City of  
7           Saratoga Springs occupational medicine  
8           services including but not limited to  
9           alcohol and drug testing procedures to  
10          its current and prospective employees on  
11          a fee-per-service arrangement.

12          I do have Christy Spadaro on the  
13          line here today if anybody has any  
14          questions.

15          Okay. Moving on to my third item,  
16          is a Discussion and Vote: MOA between the  
17          City of Saratoga Springs and Saratoga  
18          Springs PBA.

19          COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: Mayor? I  
20          will have cost outs for that, for  
21          tomorrow evening. I have them now. I'm  
22          working with our payroll coordinator to  
23          kind of summarize them and hope to have  
24          that sent out to council later today so  
25          that we have that for tomorrow night.

1           MAYOR KELLY: Great. Thank you,  
2           Commissioner.

3           The -- my fourth item is Discussion  
4           and Vote: Resolution Authorizing the Sale  
5           of Certain Real Property.

6           My fifth item is Discussion and  
7           Vote: Determination of Merit for Review  
8           for the Unified Development Ordinance.  
9           And I'd just like Vince to say a few  
10          words on this.

11          MR. DELEONARDIS: Thank you, Mayor.

12          So this is a discussion and vote for  
13          tomorrow evening that will determine  
14          whether the current draft, that is draft  
15          3 of the Unified Development Ordinance,  
16          has merit for review. And this simply  
17          sends it to the planning board and the  
18          DRC, as well as the county planning  
19          board, for a determination and an  
20          advisory opinion.

21          I know there have been some emails  
22          going around suggesting that the current  
23          draft of the UDO is not consistent with  
24          the comprehensive plan. We obviously  
25          don't believe that to be the case, that

1           we have developed this thing with a --  
2           with an eye towards compliance and  
3           consistency with the comprehensive plan.  
4           But it should be emphasized that that is  
5           exactly the role that our planning board  
6           will play. Under the zoning ordinance,  
7           they are charged with reviewing the  
8           document and rendering an opinion as to  
9           whether or not the Unified Development  
10          Ordinance is, in fact, consistent with  
11          the comprehensive plan.

12                        So council at this time is not  
13          taking any action on the document itself  
14          in terms of voting for it or approving  
15          it. They're just sending it to the land  
16          use board for advisory opinions. And  
17          this is part of the normal process.

18                        MAYOR KELLY: Thank you, Vince.

19                        COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: Can I just  
20          ask a quick question. How long will the  
21          planning board have the document for a  
22          merit for review, and can they request an  
23          extension?

24                        MR. DELEONARDIS: Yes. So under  
25          the -- Section 10 of the zoning

1 ordinance, they are afforded sixty days  
2 in which to provide their opinions. But  
3 they can have the opportunity to request  
4 an extension. And -- and that would be  
5 up to council if that request comes as to  
6 whether or not to grant it.

7 COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: And so this  
8 would be another step in the process even  
9 for the public to weigh in with the  
10 planning board on the review of the UDO?

11 MR. DELEONARDIS: Absolutely. So  
12 throughout this entire process, which  
13 goes back a number of years, the public  
14 has been welcomed, encouraged, and  
15 invited to participate in the process.  
16 We have had more than a dozen  
17 presentations by Camiros to the council,  
18 to the land use boards, and to the  
19 public. City staff, including myself and  
20 members of the building and planning  
21 department, have held I think somewhere  
22 in the ballpark of 10 Q&A workshops for  
23 the benefit of the public. But the land  
24 use board process itself is just another  
25 opportunity for the public to participate

1 and to attend those meetings and to  
2 provide comments and input to those land  
3 use boards.

4 And when we -- when you rather as  
5 council get the advisory opinions back,  
6 that is again another opportunity for the  
7 public to participate in this continued  
8 effort to update our zoning.

9 COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: And if we so  
10 choose -- I know in the past if I've --  
11 there's something I'm confused about,  
12 I've sent letters to the planning board.  
13 I don't tend to go and sit in front of  
14 them in terms of their meetings, you  
15 know, as an elected official, but if  
16 there's something specific that, you  
17 know, even a member of the council is  
18 interested in specifically, we could also  
19 send them a letter and ask them to, in  
20 particular, address certain issues.

21 MR. DELEONARDIS: Yes.

22 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Well I'm  
23 hoping to get some clarification just on  
24 specifically the greenbelt concerns that  
25 the -- that Sustainable Saratoga has been

1 bringing to our attention. The  
2 presentations from Camiros and the  
3 workshops have been fantastic, but it's a  
4 lot of information to take in and so  
5 sometimes, you know, it takes a little  
6 while to go through it and -- and see  
7 what concerns come up as result.

8 And so for me, that would be an  
9 important clarification before we do sent  
10 it off to the planning board and so  
11 forth.

12 MAYOR KELLY: And we -- we will  
13 have -- Vince -- Vince will give a  
14 detailed comment on all of this tomorrow  
15 evening and --

16 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Okay.

17 MAYOR KELLY: -- the other thing  
18 that I want to say is that the planning  
19 board, this is not the first time that  
20 they're looking at this. The planning  
21 board has been looking at this all along,  
22 you know, and Camiros has actually worked  
23 with them and presented with them. And  
24 they've had conversations, and they have  
25 with our staff. So this is not, you



1 know, something that the planning board  
2 is going to see for the first time.

3 So with that, you know -- you know,  
4 we can belabor it. I'm -- I'm still  
5 going to bring it to vote. I -- I  
6 don't -- if we don't move it on --

7 COMMISSIONER DALTON: I don't --

8 MAYOR KELLY: -- we're going to be  
9 having no -- Camiros is -- is working on  
10 basically good will right now. So we --  
11 we have to be able to either bring this  
12 home or -- or we don't. So that's kind  
13 of --

14 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Yeah, I don't  
15 want to -- I don't want to belabor  
16 anything. I just didn't want to send  
17 something to the planning board that, you  
18 know, I had concerns about and then have  
19 to bring up these concerns after the fact  
20 because I actually think that would  
21 probably be more detrimental to the  
22 process. I thought it would be more  
23 efficient to bring it up now.

24 And it's unfortunate that we've, I  
25 guess it sounds like ran out of money

1 to -- to -- to pay for this --

2 MAYOR KELLY: Well, I think --

3 COMMISSIONER DALTON: -- or I'm not  
4 sure what that means, good will --

5 MAYOR KELLY: -- this isn't your  
6 project at this time, Commissioner, so --

7 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Right, I  
8 know -- I know that. I know that. I  
9 know that.

10 MAYOR KELLY: We --

11 COMMISSIONER DALTON: I just --

12 MAYOR KELLY: -- we -- you know, we  
13 have done our due diligence and my staff  
14 has worked really, really hard. And I  
15 think that --

16 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Right.

17 MAYOR KELLY: -- they've listened to  
18 every comment out there. And Sustainable  
19 to send a form letter and have all those  
20 people send us a form letter back, it  
21 doesn't -- you know, I -- I can probably  
22 guarantee that most of those people have  
23 never read the document. And that's  
24 just -- they're supporting Saratoga --  
25 Sustainable Saratoga. That's fine. But

1 I'm going to tell you, they need to read  
2 the document and write me exactly what  
3 they want to check on. You know, not  
4 what --

5 COMMISSIONER DALTON: Well, in --  
6 in -- in fairness, it's a pretty -- it's  
7 a pretty hefty document for like an  
8 average person to read --

9 MAYOR KELLY: Yep --

10 COMMISSIONER DALTON: You know --

11 MAYOR KELLY: -- a lot of people  
12 have been home for the last year and a  
13 half, and -- and to say that they haven't  
14 had time to -- to read it, I mean,  
15 there -- you know --

16 COMMISSIONER DALTON: It's not the  
17 time --

18 MAYOR KELLY: -- most people --

19 COMMISSIONER DALTON: -- it's not --  
20 I'm not saying they don't have the time.  
21 I'm just saying it's hard for -- I mean,  
22 it's hard for me to understand the 300-  
23 page document and make sense of it.  
24 That's all.

25 MAYOR KELLY: Well again,

1 Commissioner, I have opened up my staff  
2 to every council member --

3 COMMISSIONER DALTON: No, I know.  
4 No one --

5 MAYOR KELLY: -- I have.

6 COMMISSIONER DALTON: -- no one's  
7 saying that you haven't. No one's saying  
8 that you haven't. I'm just saying that,  
9 like, when I heard -- you know, when I  
10 hear -- when I hear people say,  
11 especially Sustainable Saratoga, that  
12 they're worried about the greenbelt  
13 protection, that's something that I feel  
14 like is a really important issue to most  
15 Saratogians. And I just thought --  
16 weight the project, I don't think it  
17 would -- you know, I'm not trying to  
18 create a problem here. I'm just trying  
19 to get some clarification on something  
20 that I know is really important to people  
21 in Saratoga. That's all.

22 MAYOR KELLY: Well, I know that  
23 it -- the greenbelt is important to Mayor  
24 Meg Kelly because I have protected it  
25 throughout my -- my tenure here.

1           So I do believe that we are still  
2           protecting it. I'm just, you know --  
3           I'm -- I'm going to be taking the vote  
4           and we'll move on from there. But we  
5           will have Vince go through detail on that  
6           tomorrow night. And -- and if you have  
7           questions, feel free to write them down.

8           COMMISSIONER DALTON: Yeah, that --  
9           that -- that would be great because it's  
10          just -- you know, there's a couple of  
11          uses that were included that seem like  
12          it's a -- we're expanding uses. And so  
13          it's just clarification on those  
14          specifically that -- that I was looking  
15          for. So I guess --

16          MAYOR KELLY: Great.

17          COMMISSIONER DALTON: -- I can ask  
18          them tomorrow night.

19          MAYOR KELLY: Great. Thank you.  
20          Or -- or you know, Commissioner, we're  
21          always welcome to meet with you and --  
22          and help you with those clarifications.

23          COMMISSIONER DALTON: Okay. Thank  
24          you.

25          MAYOR KELLY: No worries.

1           Any other comments? Great.

2           And then my next item is number 6,  
3           Discussion and Vote: Approval to Adopt  
4           Citizen Advisory Committee  
5           Recommendations 2021 CDBG Funding.

6           This -- this will be -- we -- this has  
7           been out for public comment. And we  
8           received no comments at this time.

9           Number 7 is Discussion and Vote:  
10          Approval to Reimburse Employee #2175 in  
11          the amount of \$224 -- is that me? So  
12          I'll read it again. Discussion and Vote:  
13          Approval to Reimburse Employee #2175 in  
14          the amount of \$224.85. And this is for  
15          recreation tiles to protect the floor.

16          My eighth item is Discussion and  
17          Vote: Approve the Updated Return to  
18          Recreation Operational Plan. And I do  
19          believe John Hirliman was on this call --  
20          there he is. And if anybody has any  
21          questions for John, he's on the call.  
22          But they're -- they're pretty  
23          straightforward and -- and they're in  
24          accordance with the CDC.

25          Okay, thank you.

1           My next item is Discussion and Vote:  
2           Appointment to the Downtown Special  
3           Assessment District. And I will be  
4           appointing Ashley Gardner. I think most  
5           of us know her on this council.

6           The -- my tenth item is a  
7           Proclamation: May is National Bike Month.

8           And my last item is an Announcement:  
9           Development and Construction Report.

10          And that concludes my agenda. On to  
11          Accounts.

12          COMMISSIONER FRANCK: Thank you,  
13          Mayor.

14          The first two items are out of DPW  
15          for awards of bids for various chemicals.  
16          Any questions on those?

17          MAYOR KELLY: I want you to read  
18          them, Commissioner.

19          COMMISSIONER FRANCK:  
20          Hydrofluosilicic acid and I'll get back to  
21          the other one, I got to work on -- I'm  
22          retiring at the end of the year. Skip,  
23          he's going to put me in my grave before I  
24          get there.

25          And the third item is just more

1 update on Grievance Day. We are having  
2 an issue with ProServe, the company that  
3 does our online assessments that we're  
4 trying to work through -- or trying to  
5 get them to call us back. If not, we may  
6 default to the county's website, but --  
7 it's always worked well, but apparently  
8 we can't get ahold of anybody to do an  
9 update. So I'll just go over that  
10 brief -- briefly tomorrow night because  
11 Grievance Day is in a couple of weeks.

12 MAYOR KELLY: Okay.

13 COMMISSIONER FRANCK: And I have one  
14 item that we're working with DPW, another  
15 award of bid relating to Gilbert Road.  
16 So hopefully we can get that to you guys  
17 by noon today.

18 MAYOR KELLY: Great. Thank you.  
19 If -- if you need more time, just let us  
20 know.

21 COMMISSIONER FRANCK: Okay, thank  
22 you.

23 MAYOR KELLY: Yep.

24 COMMISSIONER FRANCK: That concludes  
25 my agenda.



1           MAYOR KELLY: Thank you,  
2 Commissioner.

3           On to Finance, Commissioner Madigan.

4           COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: Thank you,  
5 Mayor.

6           The first item is a discussion on  
7 the 2020 Preliminary Financial Report  
8 which is basically the annual report for  
9 year -- you know, as the picture as of  
10 year-end 12 -- 30 days hath September --  
11 12/31/2020. Each year we're required to  
12 provide the State with a summary --  
13 summary of the prior budget year by April  
14 30th, which we did, known as the Annual  
15 Update Document, the AUD. It was  
16 submitted in a timely basis and, again,  
17 gives a summary of the city's financial  
18 position at year end 2020.

19           So I'll have the full report  
20 tomorrow night as is required by the  
21 charter. We'll have the quarterly report  
22 at the next meeting. And it's just  
23 important to remember that that is a  
24 snapshot in the end of where we were as  
25 of the end of the year, 2020. And it

1 does include for the month of December  
2 the \$6 million TAN that we borrowed in  
3 order to ensure that we met payroll in  
4 January.

5 The second item is an update on city  
6 finances. Just an ongoing report on  
7 revenue, expenses, cash flow, and the  
8 status of federal and state funding, if  
9 anything has actually changed.

10 The third item is a Discussion and  
11 Vote: Beacon/Saratoga Workforce Housing  
12 PILOT Resolution and Agreement. This  
13 proposed resolution and PILOT agreement  
14 for an affordable housing project to be  
15 located at Excelsior Park, The Beacon at  
16 Excelsior Park. The project will include  
17 a total of fifty-six residential units,  
18 which will be provided to low income  
19 individuals with ranges from thirty  
20 percent AMI to ninety percent AMI. The  
21 project will include 5,171 square feet of  
22 commercial space that will be used by  
23 nonprofit entities for charitable  
24 purposes. The project will include  
25 partnerships with local not for profits.

1           The PILOT allows for a two-year  
2           period for the development to occur and  
3           sets the payment at 5,000 and \$10,000,  
4           respectively. Therefore, the PILOT  
5           requirement annual payment of \$19,600  
6           will increase at intervals every five  
7           years with payments of 21,000, 22,400,  
8           25,000, and \$26,600.

9           The agreement was developed with  
10          input and cooperation from Tony Popolizio  
11          in the accounts department, the city  
12          assessor, Christine Gillmett-Brown, the  
13          director of finance, and Lindsey Connors,  
14          our community development coordinator, as  
15          well as the city attorney, Vince  
16          DeLeonardis.

17          Item number 4 is a Discussion and  
18          Vote: Authorization for the Mayor to Sign  
19          a Memorandum of Understanding regarding a  
20          grant to the City of Saratoga Springs  
21          from the New York State Economic  
22          Development Corporation, ESD, to be  
23          administered by the New York State  
24          Technology Enterprise Corporation,  
25          NYSTEC, for a PILOT program regarding the

1 construction and implementation of LED  
2 streetlights incorporating public Wi-Fi  
3 and video analytics.

4 The finance department has been  
5 working with Tina Carton, the  
6 administrator of parks, open space  
7 sustainability, and historic  
8 preservation, and received a grant from  
9 New York State ESD to establish these  
10 PILOT programs for the conversion of LED  
11 lighting and installation of technical  
12 equipment, which saves and incorporates  
13 public Wi-Fi and video analytics.

14 The project involves multiple  
15 partnerships. And I'll have more details  
16 about that tomorrow evening. NYSTEC  
17 needs an MOU to provide to ESD confirming  
18 the city's commitment to the project. We  
19 will have a further contract to the  
20 council within the next month. The MOU  
21 will satisfy current requirements.

22 Item number 5 is Discussion and  
23 Vote: Approval to Pay Invoice #30000 -- I  
24 think that four zeros -- I can't tell --  
25 291 in the --

1           MAYOR KELLY: I count that as three.

2           COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: Three zeros?

3           MAYOR KELLY: Yep.

4           COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: In the amount  
5 of \$1,000 to Bolton St. Johns for  
6 Government Services. The PO is not  
7 submitted prior to the work commenced in  
8 April. So that's while I'll be bringing  
9 that to council for approval.

10           My remaining items are budget  
11 transfers and amendments. They include  
12 payroll changes for additional part-time  
13 employees. These are compliant with the  
14 temporary hiring pause that we have in  
15 place.

16           I may have an additional item on my  
17 agenda, I'm not sure. It looks like my  
18 item number 6 and 8 are similar, so I'm  
19 asking for clarification. If they are  
20 duplicates, I'll have that cleaned up on  
21 my final agenda.

22           And that's it. That completes my  
23 agenda. Thank you, Mayor.

24           MAYOR KELLY: Thank you,  
25 Commissioner.

1           On to public works, Commissioner  
2           Scirocco?

3           COMMISSIONER SCIROCCO: Thank you,  
4           Mayor.

5           The first item on my agenda is  
6           Discussion and Vote: this is  
7           Authorization for the Mayor to Sign  
8           contracts with Schindler Elevator Corp.  
9           for the City Hall Elevator Upgrade in the  
10          Amount of \$70,391.

11          Second item on my agenda is  
12          Discussion and Vote: Authorization to Pay  
13          Invoice #0516140 to Mahoney Notify-Plus  
14          in the Amount of \$295.70.

15          Third item on my agenda is  
16          authorization -- Discussion and Vote:  
17          Authorization for the Mayor to Accept the  
18          Donation from the New York State 150th  
19          Sesquicentennial Committee in the Amount  
20          of \$4,329.44. And that -- that's the  
21          committee that may have some funding for  
22          the civil war soldier in Congress Park.

23          The fourth item on my agenda is just  
24          an announcement. The next three items  
25          are announcements. It's just the

1 department of public works Facebook --  
2 Facebook page.

3 The fifth item is an announcement  
4 for the Sprig Tire Recycling Program.  
5 That's going to be Tuesday, May 25th.  
6 That's put on by Saratoga County Soil and  
7 Water Conservation District.

8 And the last -- number 6 is just the  
9 Arbor Day Tree Planting Ceremony. We had  
10 an Arbor Day Tree Planting Ceremony, kept  
11 it to a minimum. It -- we planted a -- a  
12 tree across the street from City Hall in  
13 front of the -- I'll have more  
14 information on that tomorrow night.

15 And again along with Commissioner  
16 Franck's agenda item if it -- if it --  
17 there's a -- there is an issue apparently  
18 with -- with the insurance with N&J for  
19 Gilbert Road. I think when we work  
20 through that, I'll be adding that item to  
21 my agenda based on what Commissioner  
22 Franck does with his -- with that item  
23 for accounts.

24 And with that --

25 MAYOR KELLY: All right.

1           COMMISSIONER SCIROCCO:  -- that  
2 concludes my agenda.

3           MAYOR KELLY:  Okay, great.  Thank  
4 you, Commissioner.

5           Supervisor Veitch, we just got an  
6 email.  He'll have one item, Building and  
7 Grounds Committee update.

8           COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Mayor?

9           MAYOR KELLY:  Oh, public safety --

10          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Can I -- can I  
11 do my --

12          MAYOR KELLY:  Yep, sorry.  Public  
13 safety.  Sorry -- sorry, Commissioner.

14          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  No big deal.

15          MAYOR KELLY:  I got ahead of myself.

16          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  No big deal.

17          My first item is a Discussion and  
18 Vote: Referral to the Planning Board and  
19 DRC for Advisory Opinions on the proposed  
20 Fire Station/EMS Station 3.

21          The second item on my agenda is a  
22 Discussion and Vote: to Amend Chapter  
23 225, Section 225-81 of the City Code,  
24 Schedule XVI - Parking Prohibited at All  
25 Times.  This is to install no parking



1 signs along Crescent Street next to the  
2 dog park. This is in response to some of  
3 the issues that the neighbors are having  
4 across from the dog park.

5 And item number 3 is Discussion and  
6 Vote: Authorization for the Mayor to sign  
7 a Medical Director contract with Dr.  
8 Jason Bernad, who is the medical director  
9 for the fire department.

10 And that concludes my agenda.

11 MAYOR KELLY: So Commissioner, can I  
12 ask a question about number 3 because  
13 I -- what -- we did Mike -- Dr. Michael  
14 Holland. Is he -- what is he?

15 COMMISSIONER DALTON: So yeah -- so  
16 before I joined the council, I think the  
17 year before, these two positions were  
18 split up into -- there's a -- we have a  
19 city health officer and then we also have  
20 someone who's specific for the fire  
21 department to handle their injuries,  
22 their issues that they have there. So  
23 it's two separate roles. So Dr. Jason  
24 Bernad works specifically with the fire  
25 department, and the fire department only.

1           Whereas the city health officer is  
2           available to work on any city-wide health  
3           issues or questions we might have.

4           MAYOR KELLY:   Okay, so if we -- just  
5           go with me for a minute.  If we have  
6           another pandemic, Dr. Michael Holland  
7           will help us take --

8           COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Correct.

9           MAYOR KELLY:  -- action?  Okay.

10          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Correct.  Yep.

11          MAYOR KELLY:  All right.  That's  
12          great.  Thank you.

13          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Sure.

14          MAYOR KELLY:  Yep.  Anything else?

15          COMMISSIONER DALTON:  Nope, that  
16          concludes my agenda.

17          MAYOR KELLY:  Okay.  Thanks.

18          On to the supervisors --

19          COMMISSIONER MADIGAN:  Mayor, before  
20          you go to the supervisors.  I was just  
21          reading this wrong.  My 6 and 8 are not  
22          duplicates.  One is a transfer, and one  
23          is an amendment, so --

24          MAYOR KELLY:  Okay, great.

25          COMMISSIONER MADIGAN:  -- just

1 wanted to clarify. Thank you.

2 MAYOR KELLY: So I'm hearing,  
3 Commissioner, that the attachments are  
4 wrong. So I -- I don't -- I -- we'll  
5 just have to doublecheck it.

6 COMMISSIONER MADIGAN: I will  
7 definitely -- I will look at them.

8 MAYOR KELLY: Okay.

9 The -- so Supervisor Veitch has one
